- 1. BV Parks and Trails is considering the purchase of land for Antenna Trail purposes. Consideration is being given to implementing a walking trail at the east end of the Village.
- 2. The Beaver Valley Age Friendly program will be under the management of the RDKB at the end of March.
- 3. The train station drawings are complete. The project is ready to go to Tender.
- 4. East End Services has decided that the transit station will be in front of Selkirk College on Cedar Avenue.
- 5. Dan Derby, RDKB Fire Chief, reported that 45% of calls are attended to by First Responders.
- 6. The SPCA is seeking a 34% increase. The RDKB has worked it to a 12.67% increase. Members of the service have questioned if a service review should be done.
- 7. The RDKB is expanding bylaw enforcement with the addition of another officer and the purchase of two vehicles. The Village will be impacted by the purchase of the two vehicles.
- 8. A resident reported an advertisement for a rental of a basement suite at 925 10th Avenue. The property is not zoned for this use. The Mayor spoke with the owner and the issue was resolved.
- 9. The Mayor addressed a situation concerning a group of individuals that entered the Village office without masks in defiance of public health orders.
