They included 1) reviewing if a new Reservoir is to be constructed, that the Village retain the existing structure and use it to store reclaimed water for extra firefighting capacity, 2) utilize Search and Rescue to help with Fuel Management activities around/adjacent to the Village, and 3) reviewed past recent wildfire activities in the Boundary area and the impacts it had on communities.
