Committee Report

Mayor Danchuk reported the following:

- 1) Provided a written and verbal report on the Waneta Expansion Project.
- 2) Provided the minutes from the February 21, 2013 LCCDT meeting.
- 3) A potato bag company has chosen not to move to Trail.
- 4) Requested that staff look into brush left in the 12th Avenue ditch after trees removed by Fortis contractors.
- 5) Reported that he was approached regarding the amalgamation of the BV May Days and Montrose Family Fun

Day. It was suggested that this be discussed at the next Recreation Commission meeting.

CAO The CAO reported the following items:

2) CAO reported that the bike racks requested are ~4m wide and in a poor condition with corrosion. The racks would likely need to be reduced in size, sandblasted, repaired and painted. The CAO also confirmed that the racks are fixed with concrete footings which would add a level of difficulty to re-installation. Similar bike racks can be purchased new for \$400.

Staff directed to thank Mrs. Reid for her suggestion and that Council will be considering the request.

- 3) CAO reported attendance at a Trail Parks and Rec Focus Group meeting with Consultants PERC. Meeting was to provide information to be used in Parks and Rec Master Plan.
- 4) CAO reported participation as Advisory Committee member for the FortisBC Kootenay Energy Diet project.

Councillor Cook requested that she be forwarded information on the KED.

- 5) CAO reported contact with FortisBC representative regarding spill risk at the Beaver Creek substation. Representative is confirming construction at this site and communicated that all sites have SCADA systems which alarm for significant leaks, site has quarterly inspections and all personnel are trained in spill response.
- 6) CAO reported the following update related to the Water Supply Improvements Project:

Water Supply transition to temporary pump procedure and schedule.

Pre-Cast Building is now constructed and interior painting has been completed.

Doors, roof hatches, and contact chamber access hatches will be installed this week.

APlus has started running electrical in the building on Friday.

Maglio is cleaning up the chlorine contact chamber; removing excess 'drippings' and finishing groutwork.

Sampling for hazardous materials at both pump-houses has been completed by Kootenay Hazmat, Nelson with costs for the testing to be around \$1000. WorksafeBC has suggested that the buildings could contain asbestos and lead paints. Confirmed tests from the lab should be received this week. Results of the tests and associated subsequent costs of possible extra work may determine that the Village consider retaining PH #2.
